With this new feature, you can expire an *existing* post or page, or set to expire, a *new* post or page. As the post or page is open, look at the right lower side to see the **Post Expirator** box similar to the one above.

1. Place a check mark in the **Enable Post Expiration**.
2. Click the arrow to the right of **Month** then select the **Day** of when you would like WordPress to expire the item.
3. Click the arrow to the right of **How to expire:**, and make your selection. Maybe to start with you can set it to private or trash.
4. Publish or Update your item to save changes.

You are done. However there are more settings to fine tune. From the WP **Dashboard**, select **Settings**, then **Post Expirator**. This feature allows expiration by Category. In addition, an email can be triggered to the administrator when an item has expired. This may be good to have as a reminder. Make desired updates and scroll to the bottom to **Save Changes**.
